
POROUS BORDERS

On view September 10 - December 5, 2010

Washington, DC: The Washington Sculptors Group (WSG) is pleased to announce the opening of *Porous Borders*, an exhibition of sculpture on the theme of interconnection despite borders and boundaries.

The show will be held in the Historical Society of Washington, D.C., and on its grounds at Mount Vernon Square from September 10 (press opening at noon) until December 5, 2010. An opening reception will take place on Wednesday, September 22, from 6:00 to 8:00 pm. A juror's talk is scheduled for Saturday, October 2 beginning at 2:00 pm.

The exhibition was juried by Jayme McLellan, director and founder of Civilian Art Projects, a gallery based in Washington, D.C. representing and supporting emerging artists. In addition to running Civilian, she curates and organizes international exhibitions and teaches at the Corcoran College of Art & Design. In 2002, she co-founded the D.C. based visual arts organization Transformer and, prior to this, served as the Director of Development for the District of Columbia Arts Center (DCAC).
